The Partnership


- Launched 2010 at the Petersberg Climate Dialogue by South Africa,
 Republic of Korea and Germany
- Semi-formal forum for political dialogue and peer-exchange
- More than 120 countries have participated in its various activities;
 open to all countries interested in ambitious climate action
- Goal: encourage all countries to step up for enhanced transparency in order to achieve the global goal of keeping temperature increase well below 2° Celsius, and pursuing efforts to limit it to 1.5°Celsius.

- Policy dialogue during Annual Partnership Retreats
