Paris Agreement decision requested the GEF to support the establishment and operation of the CBIT



Aims of CBIT (paragraph 85)

- To strengthen national institutions for transparency-related activities in line with national priorities;
- To provide relevant tools, training and assistance for meeting the provisions stipulated in Article 13 of the Agreement;
- To assist in the improvement of transparency over time.




Key Considerations

- Alignment with Art. 13 and adopted rulebook
- ✓ Alignment with NDC
- ✓ Address identified capacity needs
- ✓ Alignment and coordination with other support (i.e. GEF, ICAT, etc.)
- Inter-ministerial coordination
- Feedback of data and information into policy-development
- ✓ Linkage with the Global Coordination Platform

Programming Status as of April 15, 2019







- 26% of non-Annex I Parties supported to date
- 11 Least Developed Countries (LDCs) and 5 Small Island Developing States (SIDS)
- 17 projects have begun implementation
- 4 global projects aim to improve knowledge sharing, coordination and facilitate additional capacity-building
- 5 agencies involved to date: Conservation International, FAO, IDB, UNEP and UNDP

CBIT Outlook for GEF-7 (2018-2022)



- ✓ Continued implementation of GEF-6 projects
- ✓ New CBIT projects supported through GEF Trust Fund
 - Notional allocation of \$55 million
 - CBIT support continues from set-aside, outside of national allocations
 - Already aware of pipeline of interested countries
- ✓ Expansion of the CBIT Global Coordination Platform
 - Third CBIT Global Coordination Workshop in May
 - CBIT Global Coordination Platform and the Global Support Programme for NCs and BURs (GSP) to be combined
- ✓ Ensure alignment of CBIT projects with adopted rulebook
 - Focus on enabling countries to comply with biennial transparency reports (BTRs) by 2024
