

Building on and improving what exists



- Many different existing initiatives should provide inputs to the NDC implementation process
- A few UNDP supported areas of work, as an example:
 - The Low Emission Capacity Building Programme
 - NAP Support Programme (with UNEP)
 - GSP for National Communications and BUR (with UNEP)
 - GCF Readiness Programme
 - Large mitigation and adaptation portfolio with funding from different sources, e.g. GEF, donors, track funding, collaboration with other institutions, GCF (more recently), among others.

Key messages



- NDC implementation will require creative and ambitious approaches
- Institutional structures will need to be enhanced and strengthened, e.g. NDC implementation cannot rest solely on ministries of environment
- Proposed and foreseen actions should be engrained in countries' longterm vision
- An "incremental" approach to NDC implementation may be advisable (learning by doing and strategic gaps filling)
- Systems to track progress are essential to the success of NDCs and will require strong government buy-in and adequate resources
- Financial resources to support NDC implementation would need to look at blending different sources of funding
